PRESIDENT/SECRETARY'S REPORT

With three years of athletics behind us this Club is now showing signs of strength, not only in membership but also in performance, this being evident at this season's carnivals and State Age Championships.

Club expansion has been tremendous during this past season and I extend my thanks and appreciation to the Executive, officials and athletes for the enthusiasm and attitude in moulding this Club into one with an encouraging future.

There is no doubt that Girraween Amateur Athletic Club is catering for the youth of this area, for those who prefer their athletics close to home, not wishing to travel distances, and because their studies limit time for training and sport participation. In our Registrar's report, of the 72 members 67 are school students; 63 of these attend High School and as a result of this membership situation Saturday competition at C.V. Kelly Park has become the draw card. With the introduction of Hurdles up to 400 metres, and the steeple chase next season, it will inevitably mean a review of the Saturday programme, probably over a three-week period. The acquisition of 60 hurdles has been a great boost for the Club and this was made possible by finance from Love Industries Ltd. and construction and fabrication by Silverwater Engineering. We are grateful for the generosity of these business firms and we are encouraged by their faith in this Club's activities in offering their support.

In conclusion, my duties as President of this Club have been assisted by the support of all. Thank you.

The completion of the third athletic season witnesses the Club in a reasonably strong financial position. Following this report is a Statement of affairs and Summary of financial position set out in similar fashion as that adopted by the previous Treasurer.

We currently have a bank balance of \$320.14 compared with \$93.68 last season. To this has yet to be added interest which will accrue during the off-season.

Once again the stock of unsold singlets is reduced over that held last year. The sale value of stock is \$245.00 against \$308.50 last year.

All members of the Club deserve accolade for their efforts in producing this good foundation. Special thanks must be given to the newly formed Fund Raising Committee whose efforts resulted in an amazing contribution of \$245.41. Next year it is suggested that sponsorship be requested of \$1.00 per decibel of sound produced when this committee meets, as I feel a \$1000 should be possible.

RECORDING

The 1980/81 season proved to be a very interesting one. The changed point score system, having every week as a competitive week and only the six events with the highest points used to calculate each athlete's total for the round, has resulted in a fairer overall competition.

Assuming a score of 35 points per event (this is equivalent to achieving the result on which the handicap is based) each time the event was conducted the total point score possible is 1260; 13 athletes scored in excess of this figure which shows considerable overall improvement. A further 9 athletes scored more than 1000 points which indicates a consistent effort throughout the season.

It is hoped that additional improvements can be made to the point score system to enable an even more accurate reflection of performance to be shown by the points score. Finally, I must thank those people who have assisted in various ways in the calculations and reporting of results and ask that even more people offer their assistance for next season.

CLUB RECORDS

With the new 400 metre track there was some discussion at the beginning of the season on what to do about Club Records. It was eventually decided to keep old records until they are broken. There was an improvement in performance overall and nearly all records, field and track, were broken or equalled. Some were beaten by huge margins. Events added during the season were hurdles, at the correct height and distance for individual age groups, and the fun event of 200M hurdles which was well supported and may be a more regular event next year.

Although it is somewhat unbalanced to have "champion record holders" - when it sometimes occurs that an individual is the only one in their age/sex group - I am including them in this report because they do hold those records.

Female: Linda Hemmerling (U/12 women) and Jackie Wheeler (U/15 women) both broke 6 and equalled 1 record.

Male: Denis O'Leary (U/17 male) with 9 records, that of each event he entered as our first U/17 male. Michael McHugh (U/14 male) had a tough challenge from Garry Moran but came through breaking 8 records

I've enjoyed playing with the lists of records and watching the improvement in the Club standards over the past 2 years. Pressure of studying means that I will only be able to enjoy being an athlete next year but wish the new Records Officer a very busy 1981/2 season with weekly record breaking.

FUND RAISING
