COMMITTEE REPORTS

PRESIDENT:

Last season's membership of 59 was an increase of two over the previous season, so it would seem that we are over the drastic slump we experienced a few years ago.

However, there are three problems for which answers need to be found:-

(1) Attracting new members:

Nearly all our members are associated in some way with Girraween Little Athletic Centre, usually as current members, ex-members, parents, relatives or friends. We do not attract athletes from other little athletic centres or from local schools.

Is the name "Girraween" too insular? Does it indicate that we only cater for Girraween little athletes or Girraween residents? Would a name such as "Holroyd" or "Holroyd District" attract athletes from Greystanes, Merrylands and other areas?

I feel that it is essential for us to begin a major membership drive in local high schools as this is where the majority of athletes aged 12-18 are to be found. This could be in the form of a club flyer supplied to all children in local high schools.

(2) Loss of members:

We signed up 23 new athletes last season, but lost 21, only two of whom transferred to other clubs, so presumably they all went into retirement. Is there any way we can prevent this annual loss? Is the club failing by not maintaining their interest?

(3) Inactive members:

There were approximately 20 athletes (one third of our membership) who competed regularly last season. Why did they compete regularly and the other two thirds did not? Are we failing to provide interesting competition?

The answers to the preceding questions could mean the difference between the club's future success or failure, so I ask all members to think about these questions and contact any committee member if they have any suggestions.

The Parramatta District A.A.C. folded recently after most of their members had transferred to other clubs. I believe the Liberty Plains and Fairfield clubs have also gone out of business and the Blacktown Club changed its name and its colours in an effort to stimulate interest, but still lost many members and is struggling to survive.

So we are advancing our cause while all the surrounding clubs are dying and yet we are not attracting any of the athletes from these clubs. Nepean, 2WS and Tiger Wests are benefitting most from the demise of these clubs.

On the performance front, Craig Willetts, Bruce Hogg and Robert Kropman kept the club flag flying.

Craig won three state triple jump titles and demonstrated the art of "focussing" on the goal you wish to achieve. On the other hand, Bruce won bronze medals in state and Australian championships, but he and our other distance runners have not yet learned to "focus" on achieving major success as too often they were chasing success in minor events (or other sports, even on the day of a state championship) instead of directing their energies towards the "big one".

Robert Kropman stamped himself as a future threat when he finished second in the State decathlon championship with 6144 points which exceeded the qualifying standard for the Australian championship.

Robert and Craig were listed in the top 10 state rankings.

The format for the club championship provided very close competition at the top with two men and two women scoring 39 out of a possible 40 points. the tiebreak system was used to decide the outright champion, the male champion, the female champion and the second and third men. To me, the system is ideal as it allows any athlete to win, simply by self-improvement.

Lynette Smith deserves credit for her outstanding Blair Zone attendance and I thank the Jeffs who display the club colours all over Sydney and in some country areas.

I cannot express my admiration adequately for Helen Sestic who finished equal first with Lynette in the club championship but was relegated to second when the tiebreak system was applied. Helen is a modest girl who does not like to be singled out, but I feel that I must mention that she was awarded the little athletic centre's "Peter Herlinger Shield" for her silver medal performance in the 1500 metres walk at the state championships. Credit must also go to her sister Veronica (3rd in the club championship) whose slave - driving coaching methods helped Helen to succeed.

Our Secretary, Viv Manwaring, has been honoured with life membership of the little athletic centre for his long involvement in coaching, track marking, age managing and other duties.

Wednesday night Blair Zone competition attracted 16 athletes, 10 of them qualifying for the zone championships and seven of them bringing home 30 trophies.

Interclub at Sydney Athletic Field attracted a small representation with Robert Kropman being the most regular attender, competing for the 2WS/Blair/Central team.

The trophies for tonight's presentation have been supplied free of charge by Geoff Baldock of West Ryde Trophies, our supplier since the club's inception. Several months ago, he began a clean-out of the showroom to provide more space for new lines and offered the trophies to our club as a "thank you" for our continued support.

Our increased ground fees (up \$270) and the new water rates (around \$450) mean the reintroduction of a "fund raising officer" is now mandatory and I trust someone (or a group as in the past) will come forward and organise a car wash, a runathon, or some other event to help raise the necessary funds.

There is a proposal being planned to obtain sponsorship from a previous sponsor which, if successful, would enable us to help successful athletes with expenses and possibly attract more athletes to the club in the future.

Our club is one of the few in Sydney which does not have any registered officials, so all timekeeping, recording and measuring is done by the athletes themselves and I thank them for their efforts in this regard.

I hope that all last season's members will return in September for another season of track and field competition.

CANTEEN:

During the season, Bob Hanlon offered to serve in the canteen on Saturday afternoons and this resulted in our profit rising from \$78.06 in the previous season to \$276.70 this season.

However, toward the end of the season, Bob was unable to attend and once again we had the problem of the canteen being unmanned, thus losing sales.

It is essential for next season that we find someone to serve in the canteen on a full time basis as we must take every opportunity to raise money for the increased ground fees and newly introduced water rates.

SECRETARY:

Bob has just about said it all, so I will provide some information on management of CV Kelly Park, and financial implications for next season.

Management of the ground is in the hands of the Park Trust which is responsible to Holroyd Council. Trust members comprise representatives of the users, the local community, and the Ward Alderman. Fees levied by Council can be used by the Trust for ground improvements. For example, the Trust at the present time is pursuing automation of the in-ground sprinkler system.

I am currently the Club's representative on the Trust. Two actions by Council have a significant impact on the Club's finances:

- * Strengthening of the guidelines for ground fees meant that it was very difficult for the Club not to pay the "full use" fee for 1992 of \$550, and

- * adoption of "user pays" for water rates means the Club's share will be around \$450 per annum.

A likely income/expenditure scenario for 1992/93 is as follows:-

Under this scenario there is a shortfall in funds of \$1,020.

Purchase of at least one new javelin, a new discus, a new 50m tape, and multi stop-watch are considered necessary. Also, we are down to 9 singlets and purchase of a new batch is imperative.

Even if we "muddle through" without new equipment or singlets, there is still a shortfall in funds of \$220 which is clearly unsustainable. Canteen is a critical issue in the income side of the equation.

In these poor economic times, corporate sponsorship is likely to be hard to come by, and so I fully support Bob's emphasis on the need for a willing person to operate the canteen of a Saturday afternoon, and willing persons to organise fund-raising ventures.

REGISTRAR:

Unfortunately, pressure of other commitments meant Terri Baraniak was unable to carry out this position and I filled in for the year.

The season saw a total registration of 59 members comprising 27 women and 32 men. This is the largest membership since 1984/85 (80 which was the largest in the Club's 14-year history).

WINTER COMPETITION:

After the previous season's attendance, last season was disappointing with only four regular runners - Bruce Hogg, Wally Schmid, Nathan Schmid and Amy Thorpe.

Bruce was the most successful winter runner, finishing third in two state championships and third in one Australian championship.

Nathan ruined his prospects for the season by placing his ankle in a dog's mouth the day before the all schools cross country championships. Result? Sixteen stitches (estimated).

The find of the season was 11 year old Amy whose first race was in Parramatta Park on 13.4.91 where she struggled around an easy two kilometre course in the slow time of 11 minutes nine seconds. Four months later, on 4.8.91, she covered the tough two kilometre course at the Crest in 7 minutes 28 seconds to finish fourth in the Senior Cross Country championship for under 12 girls.

Veronica and Helen Sestic competed with the N.S.W. Walkers Club.

SUMMER COMPETITION:

The simple point scoring system introduced last season, which is based entirely on the athlete improving personal performance, was continued this season with minor modifications. The principal modification was a reduction from 5 rounds to 4 rounds to provide for preliminary grading competition and more equitable overall results.

The season consisted of 4 rounds of 4 weeks each, with competitors being awarded 1 point for every event completed up to a maximum of 5 points a round.

A bonus of $\frac{1}{2}$ point for equalling a personal best, and a bonus of 1 point for bettering a personal best, were awarded up to a maximum of 5 bonus points a round.

This meant that each competitor could attain a maximum of 10 points a round, or 40 points for the season. If a tie occurred at the end of the season, splitting rules were:-

- * wearing of correct uniform throughout the season
- * regular attendance at Blair Zone Competition, and
- * number of personal best performances in the final round.

The competition was extremely close for those athletes that competed regularly. Congratulations to those who made the effort. For those competitors, we are sure the season would have been a fruitful one.

38 Club records were established, 12 by women and 26 by men, which is down on the excellent previous season's result of 56. However it was pleasing that those records were being established by both new members and "regulars".

The disappointment was Leanne Saliba, the holder of the open 100m record, being put out of action for most of the season in what was to be her final year in little athletics by breaking a bone in her foot while triple jumping.

Ten members of Girraween qualified to compete, but only Michael Finucane, Shane Hanlon, Wayne Jeff, Nathan Manwaring, Derryn Manwaring, Lynette Smith and Meredith Jeff ended up taking part.

Because of the disappointing number of entrants who competed, the committee has voted to return to the pointscore format next season with some modifications.
