GIRRAWEEN AMATEUR ATHLETIC CLUB COMMITTEE REPORTS

PRESIDENT:

The Club's membership dropped by eight last season and, while this may not be cause for concern, we must ensure that this trend does not continue.

I wish to mention again three areas which are a worry to me:

1. Attracting new members

In the last annual report, I suggested starting a membership drive in local high schools as this is where the majority of potential athletes aged 12 to 18 are to be found.

Subsequently at the end of the last winter season Viv Manwaring produced 1100 flyers which I delivered to 14 schools surrounding Girraween. The result? One telephone inquiry.

2. Loss of members

Each year we lose approximately 20 members and attract a similar number of new members. Last season we lost 28 and gained 20 so it is extremely difficult to increase our membership.

The members we lose each season are generally not joining other clubs so why are they retiring and is there any way of retaining their interest?

3. Inactive members

Last season approximately 20 athletes attended regularly (at least 75% of the time). Why is it that the majority compete on an occasional basis and some not at all?

Because of the small number of active members the winter season, summer Saturday afternoon competition, Sydney interclub and Blair Zone were poorly supported.

On the other hand it was pleasing to note that a Club with 51 members was represented at State level by nine medallists - Craig Willetts, Lynette Smith, Bruce Hogg, Peter Murray, John Dwyer, Rebecca Deane, Nathan Manwaring, Helen Sestic and Nathan Schmid.

Other representatives at State level were Nicole Page, Kurt Quinlivan, Linda Hatherly, Natalie Deegan, Sandra Narezzi, Natalia Sestic and Melissa Briggs.

Our "athlete of the season" award goes to Craig Willetts for his State Championship win and Australian Championship bronze.

Viv was keen to reintroduce the multi event championships but the response was extremely disappointing with 11 of 16 starters completing all events.

What can I say about Lynette Smith's performance? In her third attempt at the State Heptathlon Championship, she won her first State medal (bronze). She also won three pointscores in the Blair Zone competition, won the Club champion shield for the second time, the women's championship for the third year in succession, and the women's cross country and road running championship for the first time.

Helen Sestic won the Girraween Little Athletic Centre's "Peter Casey Shield" for her performance at the Little Athletics State Championships where she finished second in the U14 1500m walk. Helen had also won the Shield the previous season.

Congratulations to Sandra Narezzi on her third placed finish in the Club summer championship. Aged 13, Sandra was competing with us for the first time. Her attendance at the Little Athletics Regional championships prevented her from trying for one more personal best which could have enabled her to finish equal first.

Five members finished on the maximum 40 points in the Club summer championship last season and the tie-break system had to be used to split them.

Monday night training was virtually ignored last season and attendance on Thursday nights was poor, usually six, but quite often less than that.

As our Club does not have any registered officials, I must thank the athletes who acted as timekeepers, measurers and recorders and in any other capacity.

Thanks to the active committee - Viv, Wayne, Meredith, Sean, Robert and Michael for their support.

The canteen's increased profit is good news and the fundraising results were a great help.

Viv has been elected president of Girraween Little Athletics Centre and I trust this will not interfere with his involvement in the senior Club where he has been a pillar of strength for the last five years.

Another matter that must be mentioned is track marking. Holroyd Council expects the two athletics bodies using C V Kelly Park to do their own marking and while it is not a popular pastime we must do our part by providing helpers for this task when called upon.

In closing I ask all members to keep athletics in the back of their minds during winter months and return on 18 September to make the Club bigger and better than ever.

SECRETARY:

For a relatively small Club, we have much talent. Take a look at the summer results and you will see we had representatives and medallists in veteran, schools, and little athletics at State level and at State and Australian championships. We also had a member on the "professional" circuit. This comprised 17 or 33% of our members.

The Club also catered for the social athletes which is typified by the fact that, of the nine winter/summer competition awards, five went to members who did not compete at the higher level.

So why do we have such a struggle retaining and attracting members? Wayne and Meredith Jeff have given me a letter which is pertinent and worth quoting:

- "We would like to table the suggestion that at some stage in the near future an informal meeting of members be organised to give thought to the season ahead. There are a number of issues that we feel are important to address.
- "Our title is Girraween Amateur Athletics Club and yet in the last season we did not truly compete as a club once. It is a widely held view among other athletes that we are a club of only ten or so members. We have little presence within athletics and we believe that this has contributed at least in part to the following:
- " 1. Over the past two years there have been a number of senior clubs fold with near or adjoining 'boundaries' to ours. These include Liberty Plains, Blacktown, Parramatta, Fairfield, and Lethbridge Park. In John Dwyer we obviously got the best of these newly available athletes, but none of the other fifty or so people already involved in athletics joined our club. Why?
- " 2. We seem unable to hold membership through the later teen years. In contrast to this the Interclub competition is domonated by athletes in this age category.
- " 3. We have no product or desirable image to attract the difficult but important sponsors' dollar.
- " Some ideas to combat this problem may be:
- " 1. Organise whole-of-club competition days against other similar size clubs of which there are many within a half-hour drive.
- " 2. Instigate a one event challenge and promote the idea to both athletes and a sponsor. For example the marketers of the Power Sled offered \$3000 two years ago to promote a single race. Illawong also has sponsored multievent and throwers carnivals.
- " 3. Make available club T-shirts etc.
- "These are only ideas, but we feel there are issues to be addressed that can improve the short and long term future of our club.

What Bob Sewell and the Jeffs are alluding to is the need for PLANNING OUR FUTURE. The planning process can provide a logical sequence for strategic thinking about the future of our club, and can provide a mechanism for putting that thinking onto paper and delivering it as actions. But it will mean time, effort and commitment to produce and implement such a plan.

REGISTRAR:

Registrations for the 1992/93 season totalled 51. This is a comparable figure to that of the past two seasons, being 59 in 91/92 and 57 in 90/91. These figures represent a significant increase on the 25 registrations in 89/90.

Of this year's 51 registrations 25 were female and 26 were male, and 28 or 55% were under the age of eighteen. As in previous years this again demonstrates that the Club caters very well for those athletes in the transition stage from Little A's to senior athletics.

It must be considered somewhat disappointing that only 28 of the 51 registered members could be considered regular attendees.

SUMMER COMPETITION:

The pointscoring system was the same as that used in the past two seasons. The season consisted of 4 rounds of 4 weeks each with competitors being awarded 1 point for every event completed up to a maximum of 5 points per round. A bonus of ½ point for equalling a personal best or a bonus of 1 point for bettering a personal best were awarded up to a maximum of 5 bonus points a round.

This meant that each competitor competed only against him/herself and the evenness of the competition was seen in the fact that five very different athletes scored the maximum 40 points.

These five athletes were then split using the tiebreak rules:

- * wearing of correct uniform through the season
- * regular attendance at Blair Zone competition, and
- * number of personal bests in the final round.

After the tiebreakers were applied Lynette Smith was in first place (again!) despite spending 2 weeks of the final round in Tasmania.

Congratulations to all the athletes who competed regularly this season. Special congratulations to a few newcomers who performed very well; Sandra Narezzi (38 points), Brad Tudman (35) and Kurt Quinlivan (33½).

CLUB RECORDS:

Excluding fun days, 55 Club records were established this past year and possibly for the first time in the Club's history there were more women's records broken than men's. 30 women's records were set by 8 different women in 11 different events, while 25 men's records were set by only 5 different men in 12 different events.

This is a fabulous result for the women with special mention going to Melissa Briggs and Rebecca Deane who broke 17 records between them.

There is a downside to these results however which is a shining example of one of the major problems we have in the Club - by the end of November (about halfway through the season) 39 records had already been set which I don't think is due to people not improving throughout the season but more due to the fact that by the end of the season we are lucky to have a dozen people show up for Saturday competition.

TREASURER:

This year's accounts opened with balances of \$431.53 in the General Account and \$49.25 in the Representative Account. This year these Accounts were combined and as at 31 May 1993 the Account showed a credit balance of \$594.61.

It is worth noting that the Club still owes \$400 for the purchase of singlets and that there were no purchases of equipment during the year. This again reinforces the situation of previous seasons that there is still no accumulation of funds to meet ongoing contingencies.

Funds were almost entirely (87%) raised through registrations, canteen sales, and raffles. The contributions of Bob Sewell and Sean Battersby in organising these fundraising activities should be acknowledged and their efforts are greatly appreciated.

The Club is very grateful to John Heyes who has audited our Accounts for eight years from 1984/85. Thanks also to John Dunn who has been auditor for this year.
