COMMITTEE REPORTS

PRESIDENT

The 1999-2000 season attracted an increased membership, but more pleasing was the fact that more athletes attended on a regular basis than in past seasons.

The 1999 winter season was a successful one with increased numbers, and medal winning performances from Keith Mayhew in cross-country events, Lisa Grant in walking, and Susan Ireland in cross-country and road walking. Our club finished tenth in the State in the winter pointscore with all athletes who competed in State championships scoring points.

A continuing problem with our summer competition is the number of athletes who arrive at the ground at 2pm and wish to compete in the first event. The gradings for heats have been completed by then and starting time is supposed to be 2pm sharp.

Misbehaviour by a small number of dual and visiting Little Athletes caused me some headaches, and the childish behaviour of a couple of the older male juniors did not set a good example for the younger ones.

The summer pointscore competition was closely contested, with Steven Williams winning for the first time from previous winners Stephen Halverson and Suresh Raju. In her first season with our club, Jemma Austin finished ahead of her sister Chelsea who was a close second in the previous season and another newcomer Kate Stockings.

Lynette Smith was a regular at the Sydney Interdistrict Competition and established new personal bests in the 200, 400 and 800. When that competition was not on, Lynette came to Girraween and broke 12 records over distances from 200 to 5000 in senior and open categories.

Congratulations to Doreen Soballa, the mother of our 1984-85 summer champion Frank Soballa, who competed as a way of increasing her fitness and improved her times dramatically during the season.

In regard to club records, I would like to have the modified program records displayed on a board so that members and visitors can see them.

Last season was my 21st as a coach at Girraween, having started with Girraween Little Athletics Centre in 1979. The kind thoughts of Suresh, Steven, Lynette, Vikki, Lisa and Julie at Christmas made me feel that all my efforts are worthwhile.

On a more serious note, the Council has sent a bill of \$1,800 for water rates to the C V Kelly Park Trust after a lapse of several years. The Trust has agreed to pay this amount, but future amounts will have to be paid by the users of the ground and that will include us.

I wish to thank:

- Lynette Smith and Vikki Savage for their efforts in raising funds;
- Helen and the Graham family for their work in the canteen;
- Steven Williams for renovating the records board, and Tony Ward for providing new tape for hurdle marker;
- Kathy Austin for her recording duties;
- Girraween Little Athletics Centre for ground marking and use of equipment;
- · the athletes and others who acted as timekeepers; and
- my fellow committee members for their efforts during the season.

Our current 2000-2001 membership has reached 29 which is a record for winter, and means that our coming summer season could be a big one. We must all try to get as many people as possible to attend particularly on our first two Saturdays, 9th September and 16th September, as small attendances on those days is not very encouraging to new people who turn up. Invite a relative, a friend, a stranger! We also need people with sparkling personalities to volunteer as "greeters" who can welcome newcomers and explain our club's activities to them.

While the increase in registrations for last season was pleasing, work remains to be done to get back to the numbers of the early 90s.

SECRETARY

Senior athlete registration numbers have been falling steadily across NSW and Australia over many years. In addition, other than insurance cover, it's difficult to see what the average athlete (ie the majority of our club members) gets out of the registration fee paid to ANSW.

At last ANSW and Athletics Australia (AA) are recognising these problems and are working together to address them. They see growth in the broad participation market (ie the fun runners) that has been ignored by them in the past. Broadening the type of membership is also being considered. It'll be interesting to see what proposals eventuate from ANSW over the next 12 months.

There are two matters - ages and equipment specifications - we need to consider for our summer competition as a result of changes at State level over the last couple of years. Ages for competitions (19 years and below) are calendar year, whereas I understand that veterans age groups continue to be age on day. Various specifications for SP have been 'metrified' and some other throws event specifications added. As mentioned in the Treasurer's report, our club is purchasing new equipment to accord with these specifications for the 2000/01 season. New records will be set, and I suggest that best performances in those events stand at season's end. Our club also needs to consider whether we adopt the veterans age groups and specifications for throws events and hurdles.

I mentioned in my report last year that C V Kelly Park Trust's next objective is to seal the top carpark. As the cost is considerable and Council has other priorities, it is unlikely to happen in the short term. The Trust has also advised that Council wants to fill in the steeplechase water jump and remove the barbed-wire fence. The committee, in noting that the steeplechase hasn't been held for many years and water rates are being reintroduced, has raised no objection to Council's request.

The Committee is proceeding with incorporation. The model constitution is being obtained from ANSW for comparison with our existing Constitution as part of the process. Any changes recommended by the committee will need to be voted on by a general meeting of members in due course. A separate but related proposal being discussed with Girraween LAC is some form of "amalgamation". Investigations are being pursued as to how other clubs/centres are structured that have combined.

It was pleasing to see Graham and Stephen receive a reward after their efforts on behalf of our club over many years.

In the Zone race series, trophies were won by Chelsea Austin, Phillip Bowden, Matthew Graham, Tristan Manwaring, Vivian Manwaring, Keith Mayhew, Vikki Savage, John Smith, Lynette Smith, Steven Williams, and me.

Matthew Graham won the trophy for the fastest U17 runner in the Trevor Lonard Memorial Handicap, and Vikki Savage won the trophy for the fastest woman.

Our club entered four teams in the State Cross-country Relay Championships, but unfortunately one runner forgot to turn up. The mud and the hay-bales made the course really enjoyable! In addition, our club entered three teams in the State Road Relay Championships.

A State winter trophy - it looked like part of a tree stump to me - was introduced by ANSW and our club finished tenth in the pointscore with all runners and walkers who finished State championships scoring points.

Lisa Grant, Julie Grant and Susan Ireland competed with the NSW Walkers Club during the winter season. Lisa put in some outstanding performances.

In our club competition, **Matthew Graham** won the overall award with 444 points. Points were scored based on how many clubmates you beat plus 1 point for starting and 1 point for finishing (maximum 32 points). Points were halved for running a lesser distance than for your age. You must have competed at least 12 times to be eligible for awards.

SUMMER COMPETITION

Girraween Athletics Club enjoyed a highly successful 1999/2000 season with 97 competitors taking part.

A comprehensive point scoring competition was used to determine the champions and placegetters. The system is based on an athlete scoring points by competing (1 point), equalling a personal best (1.5 points), or achieving a personal best (2 points). The four best events each week are counted for each competitor and the points accumulated over the season. At the end of the season, the four lowest scoring weeks are subtracted from the total. This is a fair system that also allows for enthusiastic competition in the track and field.

This year's competition was again decided on the last day of the season. Steven Williams was this season's Club Champion (96 points). Being injury free this season, Steven improved consistently with PBs early in the competition as well as during the final stages. This provided him with the eventual edge over the others. Stephen Halverson enjoyed another successful season, gaining 2nd place (94 points) for the second consecutive year. Stephen took an early lead in the competition, achieving perfect scores in eight of the eleven rounds before Christmas. Suresh Raju showed good form throughout the season, taking 3rd place (87½ points). Suresh was also a main championship contender for much of the season but was unlucky to suffer a calf muscle injury in the final stages.

The women's competition was won by Jemma Austin (84 points). Jemma enjoyed her season taking an early lead while achieving valuable PBs consistently throughout the season. She performed admirably on many occasions while participating in many events each week. Well done, Jemma. Chelsea Austin was placed 2^{nd} (79 points), also for the second year in succession. Chelsea had a busy season with athletics and her Duke of Edinburgh award. Congratulations Chelsea for your persistence and great determination to achieve this fine result. Kate Stockings was placed 3^{rd} (75 points) with this being her first year with our club. Kate is to be commended for her regular attendance and great efforts throughout the season.

A large number of visitors competed in our competition this year. Stuart Finigan gained first place as Champion Male Visitor (39 points) with Kathryn Graham taking first place as Champion Female Visitor (53 points).

We have continued with awards for various age groups. Athletes were required to compete in at least 50% of the total competition days in order to be eligible for these awards. The results for the age groups are:
