Lauren Tisdale is a case in point. Lauren was the only Girraween Athletics Club athlete who competed in the NSW Championships in March. Lauren hit the 3.00m mark in the pole vault achieving a new personal best in the process at these championships. No mean feat. Two weeks later at an ANSW All Comers meet at SOPAC, Lauren raised her personal best yet again to 3.10m. That's two new personal bests in the space of a fortnight. Given the pole vault is an incredibly technical event often affected by the elements, this was an extraordinary achievement by Lauren. All at Girraween Athletics send their congratulations to her and wish her all the best as she continues her career in this challenging discipline.

At a ANSW All Comers meet at SOPAC in March a number of Girraween athletes in Lauren Tisdale, Vince Adams, Puja Srestha, Claudio Corvalan and Cristobel Corvalan representing Girraween well competing in a variety of events. These All Comers meets are important and while it was one of the last meets of the 2018-2019 summer season, it was still pleasing to see Girraween represented at this meet and all our athletes are to be congratulated for stepping up to take part in this level of competition.

The parkrun concept continues to grow and Girraween athletes continued to support parkrun well at a number of venues in March. Geoff Sheargold finished the month off strongly by finishing in first place in the last two Parramatta parkruns in March, no mean feat. Geoff is running most consistently at this time. Steve Oldridge reached his 100th parkrun early in March and is to be congratulated on reaching this significant milestone. Well done Steve. Greg Sargeant, two and Adam Etherington, Mischelle Otte, Andrew Free, David Perry, Chloe Grogan, Michael Grogan and Michael Christie all gained new pb's in March which they were most satisfied with. Another Girraween parkrun event was held at Rouse Hill in March on a very misty morning. But all runners were thankful that it was a little cooler than their last trip to Rouse Hill in January. A big thank you to Rod Zammit for coming up with this concept over the 2018-2019 summer season. It has undoubtedly been successful in publicising the Girraween Athletics Club.

The iconic Six Foot track race was held in March and this year Girraween had two representatives in Geoff Sheargold and Rod Zammit. It was Geoff's eighth Six Foot, no mean feat and he turned in another fine performance. It was Rod's debut and at the 22km mark he was hit by cramp. Nevertheless he battled on gamely and he was able to finish under the seven hour cut off. It was an epic performance by Rod and we send both Geoff and Rod our congratulations on their fine achievement.

The SMC Road series was held at Greystanes in March and the conditions that confronted all runners was appalling with torrential rain soaking all competitors for the entire event. Nevertheless, there were a number of fine performances by Girraween athletes. Stephen Mifsud had another very fine run in the Half Marathon. There were eye-catching performances by both Tony Coles and Rod Zammit in the 10km event. The 5km saw solid efforts by both Steve Oldridge and Michael Grogan. Our young contingent in Chloe Grogan and Hayley Zammit both put in excellent runs. Yet all things considered the winner on the day overall, was definitely the rain. Girraween representative's stuck to their task well in the circumstances.

Early in March the well regarded Orange Running Festival was held in, you guessed it in Orange in the NSW Central West. A number of Girraween Athletes took part. Tony Coles, with first place in his category and Stephen Mifsud with second place in his category both ran very well in the Half Marathon. Both Graham Sheargold and Suresh Raju also competed in this race and hung in well all things considered. Kim Cole had a run in the 10km event and ran very solidly.

At the very end of March the inaugural RunWest event was held, with two runs. The 12km race started at Sydney Motorsport Park at Eastern Creek with competitors running around the circuit, through Eastern Creek, the soon to be open Sydney Zoo at Bungarribee Park, the Western Sydney Parklands, part of the Rooty Hill parkrun course and finishing in Rooty Hill near the railway station. The 4km started in the international Sports Park at Rooty Hill, then down and back up Eastern Rd Rooty Hill and finishing at the same location as the 12km event. A big number of Girraween athletes took part in both events. Tony Coles had a superb run in the 12km event, whilst Danny Martins was not far behind with an excellent effort. Shane Clubb was also not far behind Danny with a fine run. Two of the remarkable performances came from Hannah Hamilton who finished second in the 12-15 category, with a great run in just over the hour. Congratulations Hannah. Chloe Grogan was third in the 0-11 category with an excellent effort. Well done Chloe. It was most refreshing to see such a great Girraween turnout supporting this 12km run. The stand out performances from a Girraween perspective in the 4km came from Adam Etherington who was first in his category with a speedy time, followed by Kim Coles who came second in her category. Congratulations to both Adam and Kim. A really nice touch was the participation in the 4km event by the Farrugia and Zammit clans, with both families completing the distance and living to tell the tale. On a serious note, the 4km event is about family participation at all ages and this was illustrated by both families. Well done to everyone and it's to be hoped that in 2020 the organisers cater to the needs of all families in the shorter event. It would also be remiss of me not to mention our Girraween volunteers who were spotted at West HQ fulfilling a valuable role. Thank you to Wayne Thurlow, Steve Williams, John Smith, Brad Milosevic and George Milosevic for giving up their Sunday to add their invaluable experience to the volunteer workforce at their location. They did a superb job and from a Girraween participant's perspective it was a very nice touch to see a friendly face after the trek to West

HQ from the finish line. Thanks on behalf of everyone guys. Mischelle and David Otte who have been race directors since the beginning of Rooty Hill parkrun deserve great praise for their role and Mischelle had been named a special ambassador in recognition of her efforts in encouraging the parkrun community to support RunWest. By all accounts it was successful as there were a large number of parkrunners participating in both events. Great stuff Mischelle. This event has enormous potential in the years ahead and it is to be hoped that the organisers of the 2020 event take on board the feedback they will receive from the inaugural version in 2019.

In March, Brad Milosevic ran his first marathon since August 2017 at the Lake Biwa Mainichi marathon in Japan in chilly conditions. Whilst it was a hard day at the office for Brad, nevertheless it was another learning experience in his ongoing marathon journey and we wish him well as he continues to explore all possibilities in this event into the future.

While not listed in the results, Lisa Grant completed another Sydney Summer Series of Orienteering held on a Wednesday evening over the summer months at different venues around Sydney. Lisa was 1st in the Open Women's category. In a remarkable display of consistency Lisa's average over the best twelve races was 100 each race which is the highest you can average. It was a very high class competition and Lisa is to be congratulated on her fine achievement. Michael Free is another Girraween athlete who competes in this competition on a regular basis and Michael had a very fine season finished 17th out of eighty-seven competitors in an excellent season. Well done to both Lisa and Michael on their efforts.
