The 2017 version of the ANSW State Relays saw an un-seasonally wet weekend for this year's State Relays, particularly on the Saturday. Having said this, it was a change from the warmer weather of 2016 at Blacktown. Across the weekend, six teams represented Girraween across a variety of events.

Saturday saw three Girraween teams competing. The Men's U18 team came second in their heat making through to the final in a compelling performance. Given the depth of competition in this event and the fact that the 100 metres could not be considered this team's specialty it was a fine performance by all four athletes and they are to be congratulated for their efforts.

The women's U18 High Jump Relay team had a tough competition in challenging weather conditions. So therefore, the team of Steve Williams, Claudio Corvalan, Michael Grogan and Stephen O'Donnell deserve great praise for their efforts and our heartiest congratulations. It was also very fitting that former club president Steve Williams was involved in this team, since he was president back in 2003 when the first Girraween teams competed at these State Relays and for the ensuing nine seasons after this.

Sunday saw improved weather conditions and a further three Girraween teams competing. The Men's Long Jump Relay team competed in the open category and once again acquitted themselves well in a competition where three of the four members were competing well above their age categories and against team teams that were chock full of specialists. It was another gutsy performance by all four team members.

Sunday also saw the Men's Shot Put 160+ Relay team of Claudio Corvalan, Michael Grogan, Stephen O'Donnell and Rob Giesler have a great completion and they came away with a

well-deserved bronze medal. A very special mention to Rob Giesler who filled in at late notice to ensure this team was able to compete. Without Rob putting his hand up, there may have been no team. Thanks Rob. All members threw to the best of their ability and it was very fitting that the team came away with a medal.

The sole Girraween track team on Sunday, the men's 4x100m 200+ team ran most consistently in their event and had to be pleased with their efforts, as when one looked at the times, they were not far away from a medal. It was another sterling performance by a Girraween team.

Congratulations to all Girraween members who competed over the weekend. This can be an intimidating event at times, given the size of representation of many of the bigger clubs, yet the important thing to always remember is that Girraween Athletics Club continues to have a presence at this type of event.
